What is MINT-EC?

MINT stands for Mathematics, Computer Science, Natural Sciences, and Technology; the German equivalent to STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics). MINT-EC is a German network of excellent STEM secondary schools (grades 5 through 12). Acceptance into this network is competitive and validates the high quality of our school's STEM profile.
