### WELCOME

The German International School Washington D.C. (GISW) is one of the leading international independent schools in the Washington D.C. metro area. More than 550 students from different countries and diverse cultural backgrounds are taught here from preschool through Grade 12 when they graduate with two degrees: the German International Abitur and an American high school diploma.

Our Elementary School stands out by fostering an outstanding learning environment within the individual learning groups and a warm and inviting school atmosphere. Students enter elementary education at the School Entry Level (SEL) and move on to the upper school after Grade 4.

The German language and culture are at the center of our teaching program, but our daily school life is full of culturally diverse experiences.

As the only full-time German school in the Washington D.C. metro area, GISW has been offering an excellent education to children of internationally-minded families for over 60 years.

GISW is not just the first MINT-EC school in the United States (i.e. STEM-certified) but it is also accredited with the German Ministry of Education and approved by the Department of Education of Maryland.

## SCHOOL ENTRY LEVEL

At our School Entry Level (SEL) we focus on getting our youngest students school-ready while still prioritizing play time. In small groups, students explore basic mathematical, linguistic and scientific concepts in a play-based manner.

By the time they enter Grade 1, our students have developed the necessary skills and competencies to begin reading and writing in German and to actively participate in other subjects, such as Mathematics, English, Social Studies, science, music, and art.

During the School Entry Level, the main focus is on helping our students develop sound social-emotional skills.

#### GRADES 1 TO 4

The rigorous curricula at GISW are based on the school curricula of the state of Thuringia in Germany for the following subjects: German, Mathematics, Social Studies, Music, Art, Physical Education and Swimming. Additionally, our students are exposed to the basics of computer science by learning to use iPads responsibly.

The subject English is taught starting in Grade 1. In Grades 2 to 4, English is taught in three separate learning groups, depending on language proficiency level.

Our curricula and teaching methods foster problem-solving, teamwork and creativity to help our students develop intellectual, emotional and social competencies that are necessary to thrive in a globally oriented world.

In Elementary School, students of grade 3 and 4 elect two class representatives who are role models and help fellow students and/ or teachers in the classroom, when necessary, but also learn to represent their class and school. All class representatives meet once a month in the Elementary School Council.



### RESPONSIVE CLASSROOM

The Responsive Classroom concept is at the basis of our social-emotional program at the Elementary School. This concepts aids students in developing strong classroom communities and a strong school identity which in turn provide the students with a great sense of safety and positivity in everyday school life.



#### THE CHURER MODEL

We work in accordance with the Churer model, which supports selfmotivated learning in our students. Our faculty prioritizes discovering and fostering the learning needs of the individual students in their classroom.



#### FASTTRACK

FastTrack is a program offered at GISW to support students in learning German. Thanks to this program, academically strong and highly motivated students are able to start at the German International School Washington D.C. up to Grade 5, even if they do not have any prior German language skills.



## MINT / STEM

Since 2018 GISW has been an accredited MINT-EC school. The MINT program fosters student interest in the sciences. The MINT acronym stands for **M**athematics, Informatik (Computer Science), **N**atural Sciences and **T**echnology.

GISW SCHOOL BUS GISW offers school bus service to Maryland, Virginia and Washington D.C.




#### BUDDY, OUR SCHOOL DOG
