



Dress Code

*Revised on June 12, 2023 in cooperation with student government
Approved on October 16, 2023*

Basic Principles:

- The dress code applies to students of all genders equally.
- All students must dress appropriately for a learning environment spanning from preschool through 12th grade.
- Information on the dress code should always include examples of students of all genders.
- Teachers should hold students of all genders to the dress code equally.
- All students may express their personality through their clothing choice if the following guidelines are followed.

Not appropriate for the school day are:

- Clothing items with offensive, racist, sexist, religiously discriminatory, inciting, violent, or drug glorifying prints.
- Accessories (necklaces, belts, pendants, etc.) with an aggressive or violent connotation
- Tops that are cropped above the belly button
- Strapless and backless clothing items
- Tops with deep or unbuttoned cleavage as well as mesh shirts or stockings
- Hats, beanies, caps and hoods during class
- Extremely short shorts, dresses, and skirts (should cover at least 1/3 of the thigh)
- Undergarments worn as clothing (undershirts and muscle shirts)
- Pool slippers or no footwear at all
