The German International School Washington D.C., founded in 1961, is a private, co-educational institution with over 500 students in preschool through 12th grade, set on a quiet campus in Potomac, MD. Representing more than 30 different nationalities, our student body is truly international, united by a shared interest in German language and culture. As the only full-time German day school in Washington, we offer rigorous academics in a warm, multicultural setting. The school has a rigorous German curriculum mixed with some American elements. Graduates receive the globally recognized German International Abitur (DIA) as well as a high-school diploma from the state of Maryland. There are two academic focus areas: world languages and science. Students gain fluency in at least two languages and achieve mastery of biology, chemistry, and physics. Our teachers prize critical inquiry, teaching students how—not what—to think. Graduates leave GISW prepared to enter any university worldwide.



The German International School is accredited by the German Ministry of Education and approved by the Maryland Department of Education. Our German curriculum is based on that used in the state of Thuringia, known for its high academic standards.

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Student Population

The school serves over 500 students from about 30 countries speaking over 25 languages. An increasing number of students start in the early childhood program with no German language skills. Small class sizes with 1-2 teachers. Graduating classes range from 25-35 students.



STEM School

The GISW has been recognized for its outstanding offerings and achievements in STEM subjects and is an accredited member of the German network of excellent MINT-EC schools. This provides exciting opportunities for our students interested in the STEM field.



Campus

The school is set in a quiet neighborhood located 20 minutes outside of Washington, DC. The facilities include a Gold LEED-certified Science building, a heated indoor pool, three libraries, three indoor gyms, two soccer fields, outdoor tennis court, cafeteria, and ample outdoor recreation areas. Bus service is available for students ages four and above throughout Washington, D.C., Maryland and Northern Virginia.



Testing & Assessment

The German education system relies far less on standardized and multiple-choice tests than schools in the US. The focus of assessments is essay, analysis and interpretation. SAT combined score average: 1343. ACT composite score average: 28. Students do not take the TOEFL as long as their score on the Critical Reading section of the SAT Reasoning Test is above 600.



Faculty

We have about 85 teachers across all divisions. Our usual staffing includes 12 teachers sent from Germany for a period of up to 6 years. Most teachers have advanced degrees and are German native speakers. The main instructional language is German.

German International Abitur: Qualifies for admission to German and European universities. American institutions typically grant advance standing or extra credit for the Abitur. German courses in grades 9-12 are all taught at an advanced level.



Activities & Athletics

After school enrichment activities offer students the chance to participate in a wide variety of clubs, programs, and teams such as Model UN, TED public speaking, debate team, and high-level STEM courses. Upper School students participate in competitive teams in the following sports: Basketball, Tennis, Soccer, Swimming, and Volleyball.



Curriculum

The following subjects of the advanced German curriculum in Grade 11 and 12 have been approved by the College Board as AP Courses: **Biology, Calculus AB, Chemistry, English, French, German, Physics 1, Spanish and Statistics.**

Each year, approximately 80% of our students attend university in Germany; 20% study elsewhere.
